I hope you all have been setting aside pieces to enter in the 2024 San Bernardino County Fair this year. The theme is "Truckloads of Fun!" I don't have the timelines just yet. Generally, submissions need to be registered around the 15th of April.

RECIPE

Pumpkin Sugar Cookies

Ingredients:

- 3 C. All purpose flour
- 1 tsp. baking soda
- 1 tsp. cinnamon
- 1/2 tsp nutmeg
- 1/2 tsp ground ginger
- 1/2 tsp ground cloves
- 1/4 tsp salt
- 2 sticks unsalted, room temp butter (equal to 1 Cup)
- 3/4 C. granulated sugar
- 3/4 C. brown sugar

1/3 C. pumpkin puree (blot with paper towel to remove excess liquid) Instructions:

The dough needs to chill in the fridge for 30 minutes before baking.

In small mixing bowl combine, flour, baking soda, cinnamon, nutmeg, cloves and salt. Set aside.

In another bowl, beat the butter, sugar and brown sugar with electric mixer for 1-2 minutes.

Add the pumpkin and beat again to combine.

Gradually add in the dry ingredients on low or by hand. This dough will be thick.

Using your cookie scoop form balls. Roll in hand to make round balls. Place cookie balls on parchment lined cookie sheet and refrigerate for 30 minutes.

Pre heat oven to 350 degrees.

After cookie dough is chilled, roll each ball in sugar and place on cookie sheet 2" apart. Bake for 15-19 minutes or until edges have a faint golden color.

Allow cookies to cool on cookie sheet for 15 minutes and then transfer to cooling racks.
